Kelly asked if low enrollment was common for all the charter schools. Sheena replied that it was common for Salt Lake Schools that went online. Other charter schools were bursting with students because of offering face to face or already online format. Kelly is needed to help find a niche to draw students to the school. <br> Assessment Report: Introduced a lot of strategies which includes Visible Learning. Teacher Clarity is what the state put out that teaches what, why and how to teach. To the kids it's What are you learning, Why are you learning it and How are you learning it?" Implementing that and data dives. Teachers determine the student levels. Tier 1Child on their way to proficiency. Tier 2-Child that needs to repeat it. Tier 3-Child that needs intensive learning.
