Financial Report:	 Rich shares that next month we will be meeting to approve the final budget for FY22 and adopt the FY23 budget. Budget hearing - The first draft of the FY23 budget will be posted in the school, on the phlearning.org website and the public notice website. <u>April's Finances</u> Showed 92 days of cash on hand, down from 95 from last month. Federal reimbursements will occur through the summer. Local revenues were 83% and we will be close to the same in state revenues. Salaries and benefits are on track. Questions were asked and answered regarding the amount on cards. Purchases are coming from being back in school after Covid. FY23 Proposed Budget (First Draft) State has told us revenue based on 322 on October's count. There are additional grants that we need to accurately spend. There is a 12% increase in salaries and wages, due to hiring and retention of teachers. Some areas will have a decrease due to Covid related purchases that will not need to be purchased again.

School Report:	 Sheena: Enrollment is at 317. <u>Project 100</u> is still in effect, getting an additional 100 students will help. <u>Calendar Updates</u> The Alumni Banquet was canceled due to lack of seniors getting back to May Day, Aug 25th 6pm-8pm, everyone is invited to that. 8th Grade Field Day Kindergarten & 8th grade promotion 8th Grade Lagoon Physics Day Our 8th graders placed 1st, 2nd & 3rd for the first time in history. The students were judged on their project and their explanation of their projects. Teachers We need to hire about 7 teachers.

School Report (cont):	 We are losing our Middle School teachers and one of our 6th grade teachers. One teacher is going into a private school and the rest are going to public schools. (Rich) Districts are able to pay more to teachers because they can tax. Our revenue is based on enrollment. <u>RISE Testing</u> Our ELA goal is 36% student proficiency - 2019 had 28% proficient students, 2021 had 18%, Friday we were sitting at 26%, pending a few students still needing to take their test. Our Math goal is 32% student proficiency - 2019 had 24% proficient students, 2021 had 14%, Friday, we were sitting at 16%, pending a few students still needing to take their test. Science goal is 35% student proficiency - 2021 had 18%, 23% as of Friday, pending a few students still needing to take their test.
