# What is Title One?

Title I is a federal program that provides funding to schools to support **students who need extra help to succeed academically**, particularly in reading and math. The goal is to ensure every student has the opportunity to meet state academic standards.

## How Does Title 1 Help Students at Pacific Heritage Academy?

- Provides **extra instructional support** in reading, math, and other key areas.
- Offers **small-group instruction, interventions, and tutoring** for students who need additional help.
- Monitors student progress closely to ensure students are meeting their goals.

# Parent and Family Engagement

We believe parents are essential partners in student success. Title I encourages family involvement through:

- **Annual Title I Parent Meeting** – Learn about the program, school goals, and how you can support your child.
- **Parent and Family Engagement Policy** – Outlines ways parents can be involved in school planning and decision-making.
- **School–Parent Compact** – Agreement that shows how students, parents, and teachers share responsibility for learning. (*Signed when you registered your student at the beginning of the year*)
- **Workshops and Communication** – Tools and events to help families support learning at home.

# Student-Led Conferences

- A key part of student learning and Title I support is the **Student-Led Conference**, where students share their work, reflect on progress, and set learning goals with their parents and teachers.
